Dr. Stewart Edelstein is Executive Director of the Universities at Shady Grove and Associate Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs for the University System of Maryland. USG is comprised of nine public universities offering 80 bachelors and graduate degrees, serving over 4000 students. He serves on the Montgomery County Chamber of Commerce and co-chairs its Economic Development Committee. He also serves on the Committee for Montgomery and the Montgomery County Business Roundtable for Education. Dr. Edelstein received his bachelor's degree from the State University of New York at Buffalo and his Ph.D. from the University of California at Berkeley. USG under Dr. Edelstein's leadership has worked closely with Montgomery College and Montgomery County Public Schools to better articulate curriculum planning and college access initiatives within the county. An important partnership initiative is a series of 2+2+2 programs – together with MCPS and Montgomery

College – to create education and career pathways in health and technology fields. These programs place special emphasis on strengthening the pipeline for minority and first generation college student populations.
