Rockville, MD – On March 16, 2018, the Montgomery County Chamber of Commerce (MCCC) brought nearly 1,200 business, government, and public safety leaders together to thank the brave men and women who protect our community every day at the 44th Annual MCCC Public Safety Awards Luncheon.

The Chief Bernard D. Crooke Jr. Community Service Award was presented to Police Officer III Melissa Coligan.

This year, attendees remembered and offered tribute to three fallen officers:

Master Firefighter Charles "Rick" Gentilcore was found on Friday, April 7, 2017, unresponsive at Burtonsville Fire Station 15 Department where he served as a firefighter for 23 years. Rick had served Montgomery County since 1994, first as a volunteer for Burtonsville VFD, and the last 11 years as a career member.

Deputy Chief State Fire Marshal Sander Cohen of the Office of the State Fire Marshal and also a lieutenant with the Rockville Volunteer Fire Department stopped to help a car on southbound I-270. The driver of the car was Supervisory Special Agent Carlos Wolff of the FBI. Both men were struck and killed in the incident on Friday, December 9, 2017.

In addition, 132 Montgomery County Police Department detectives received a Unit Citation (some posthumously) for their work over the years on this case.

Congressman John Sarbanes, Lt. Governor Boyd Rutherford, and Montgomery County Council President Hans Riemer also shared their gratitude during the ceremony.

Prior to the Awards Ceremony, awardees and special guests met the five Public Safety Chiefs of Montgomery County at the Meet the Chiefs Reception, sponsored by Pepco, An Exelon Company, followed by the General Reception, sponsored by Marriott International.

The Annual MCCC Public Safety Awards is the largest of its kind in the region. Forty four years ago, the MCCC was chartered by Montgomery County Government to host an annual event where the community, colleagues, families, citizens and officials could honor first responders from the public safety agencies.
